## Fred Hoyle on the Boil

Eminent 20th Century Scientist Fred Hoyle gave a very useful lesson about prediction in science. An astronomer produced a mathematical formula that accurately predicted the number of sunspots over the whole of a century. But the formula failed completely when new data came in. Hoyle concluded that it is easy to find a formula that fits the data, but difficult to invent one that predicts future events.
